#### **Food Bank of Northern Nevada:**

### **Community Health Alliance:**

- Individuals and families in Washoe County can access healthy food from CHA's Food Pantry at their Wells Avenue Health Center on 1055 South Wells Avenue. The pantry is open Monday through Friday 8 a.m. – 12 p.m. and 1 -5 p.m. Food can be delivered to clients in their cars if they choose not to enter the health center. If clients are walking or riding the bus, they can wait outside for their food. People with questions can call the main line, (775) 329-6300, and ask for the Food Pantry. The Food Pantry is targeted primarily at CHA patients, but is open to new clients due to the level of need in the community. New clients will need to fill out registration paperwork. One unique aspect of CHA's pantry is that CHA providers can write a prescription for food that is tailored to any medical conditions the patient is experiencing.

Yerington Food Pantry operates Tuesdays from 2:00 PM to 5:00 PM, Wednesdays from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM, and Thursdays from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM at 124 West Bridge St., Yerington, NV - 775-350-4597. - Funding through the CARES Act: To qualify for financial assistance applicants will need to show they have income to sustain their household once the assistance period ends. This is not to be permanent housing assistance (Rapid Rehousing), it is intended to be a one time assistance period to prevent an individual or family from entering homelessness or exit homelessness. Applicants will need to meet the income guideline of 80% Area Median Income or below. Applicants will also need to meet one of the following criteria: Homeless- staying in a place not meant for human habitation (car, street, tent), Homeless - staying in an emergency shelter, Fleeing domestic/partner violence, Leaving a transitional housing program, Facing eviction within 30 days, Doubled up and must leave current housing, Sudden significant loss of income, or Unpaid bills that will lead to eviction (medical bills, vehicle repair, etc.). ## **College Student Specific Resources:**

### **Financial Assistance (Student Loans)**

Starting March 13, 2020, federal student loan interest rates will temporarily be set to 0%. This only applies to federal student loans, not private loans. Your student loan servicer will change your interest rate to 0% automatically. This means that you won't owe any interest on your federal student loans during this 60-day period. However, a "forbearance" is not automatic and must be requested from your servicer. A forbearance means that you do not have to pay your student loan bill for 60 days without incurring any penalties. Remember that you don't have to pause student loan repayment for 60 days; it's optional. To apply for a forbearance, contact your servicer directly.
